



Active surveillance by Community Mobilisers-The team facilitated 2,500 home visits for guarantine and contact tracing across 23 UPHCs. Out of a total of 343 (three hundred forty three) cases, 89 active cases and a total of 241 (two hundred forty one) cases got discharged and 13 deaths recorded as on June 30, 2020.
